\$5,000 Grant Made to RUSH Back to Local Program

The RUSH Back to Local Businesses gift card programwas developed to create immediate revenue and aid the recovery process for local businesses that suffered during the COVID-19 pandemic. Customers purchased \$30 gift cards for just \$20. Sponsors like RCCF made up the \$10 difference so that the participating businesses would receive the full amount. The gift cards sold out in three hours, and together we pumped almost \$60,000 into local businesses!

Our lives changed in an instant once the pandemic reached Indiana, including daily routines for students.

A serious challenge Rush County Schools faced was that not all students had Intenet access at home. Donations to the Rush to Help: COVID-19 Rapid Relief Fund provided a \$5,000 grant to fill this gap. RCS purchased WiFi hotspots with three months of connectivity to make certain all students could continue learning.
