Servants at Work \$3,500: Community Grant

Thanks to the Rush County Community Foundation, more Hoosiers have a way out of their homes—and into the life they deserve.

With a generous \$3,500 grant from RCCF, SAWs built two life-changing ramps in Rush County:

• A 71-ft ramp in Carthage, and

• A 42-ft ramp in Rushville.

The Carthage ramp, featured here, was built for a 64-year-old woman who uses an electric wheelchair. Before the ramp, she regularly missed medical appointments. Now, she can independently travel from her front door to her vehicle—and get where she needs to go.

\$10,757.87: Community Grant

Rushville Fire & Rescue's extrication equipment was more than 11 years old. They purchased a combination tool that will easily cut and manipulate today's newer vehicles, for Rescue 1. This new equipment is battery operated, which cuts setup time drastically for extrication operations. This saves countless minutes on scene when time really matters, especially when they have small crews or multiple calls.

This equipment has the potential of helping every person that drives through our area.



Rush County Farm Bureau: Ag in the Classroom: Mr. Brown's Cows

"This was such a great lesson! Mrs. Fudge always uses the best visual aides. The kids loved the examples with the toy tractors and their new books! Thank you!"




